COUNCIL ACTIONS REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING MAY 18, 2009

- Concluded deliberations related to an appeal of a January 20, 2009 Planning Commission decision regarding a home occupation use located at 7956 Indian Hill Road. The appellant subsequently withdrew the appeal and Council determined that it was not necessary to render a decision.
- Emergency passage of an ordinance establishing a Building Improvement fund, a Water Works Improvement fund and making appropriations for the expenses from the funds for the fiscal year 2009. **These funds were set up to receive the proceeds associated with the pending issuance of general obligation bonds.**
- Emergency passage of an ordinance amending Ordinance No. 01-09 and making appropriations for the expenses of the Village of Indian Hill for the fiscal year 2009. **The emergency appropriations**

increased funding for expenditures related to attorney fees, the receipt of Federal Emergency Management Agency funds for 2008 storm clean-up, and accounted for a loss on the sale of stock held in the Rowe Arboretum Fund.

**EXPERT WITNESS TESTIMONY REGARDING ANDERSON TOWNSHIP MINE APPLICATION
EXPECTED TO CONCLUDE ON MAY 20, 2009**

Village officials continue to attend Anderson Township Board of Zoning Appeals (ATBZA) hearings regarding a request for a conditional use permit and related variances required to allow Martin Marietta Materials, Inc. to operate a deep limestone mine in the vicinity of Round Bottom Road and Broadwell Road in Anderson Township. The hearings, which have been continuing since August 2008, are now expected to continue until sometime in July of this year.

The next meeting is scheduled for May 20, 2009 at 5:30 p.m., so it will be concluded prior to the printing of this issue of the Bulletin. Attorneys representing the various opponents to the mine are expected to conclude their opponent expert witness presentations at this hearing. Assuming that the opponent testimony is concluded at this meeting, the June 4th meeting will offer the first opportunity for opponent testimony from interested citizens. Any concerned Indian Hill residents are encouraged to attend this meeting which will be held at 5:30 p.m. at the Anderson Center located at 7850 Five Mile Road.

Village officials and our legal counsel will continue to attend the hearings and express our concerns about noise, truck traffic, light pollution, and dust pollution. We will also continue to advise residents about the status of the case and any related Village actions in direct mailings to south Indian Hill neighborhoods, future Bulletin articles, and on the Village webpage: www.ihill.org.

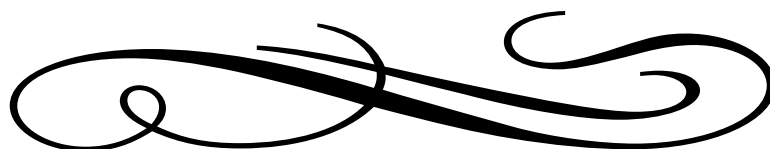

VILLAGE RECEIVES AAA BOND RATING

Standard & Poors has recently upgraded the Village's bond rating from 'AA+' to 'AAA' in advance of the issuance of \$6 million in general obligation bonds. The proceeds of the bonds will fund about half the costs associated with the Ranger and Administration Building expansion project and \$4 million in Water Works system improvements which will begin later this year. The bonds are expected to be marketed at the end of May or early in June.

The 'AAA' is the highest rating applicable to public sector bonds, and there are only a handful of Ohio cities and school districts that enjoy this prestigious bond rating. The Indian Hill School District also received a similar 'Aaa' bond rating from Moody's Investor Services prior to the issuance of debt related to the District's capital building program in 2005 and 2006.

The improved rating was based upon the results of a comprehensive financial analysis which reflected the Village's participation in the deep and diverse Cincinnati metropolitan area economy, very strong income and extremely strong community wealth levels, good management practices, and low overall debt level as a percentage of market value. The 'AAA' rating will enable the Village to market the bonds at reduced interest rates and realize substantial debt service cost savings over the life of the bond issuance.



Indian Hill Cub Scout Pack #163 Celebrates 62 Years of Cub Scouting in our Community

Today, as it was in 1947, the Indian Hill Cub Scout Pack 163 is dedicated to the character development of the young boys in our community.

Over 70 boys from the Indian Hill School district and the Cincinnati Country Day School are active participants in the local Cub Scout Pack. Most of these boys range in the ages of 6-10.

The goal of this Cub Scout Pack is to enrich the lives of its Scouts and their families by providing fun activities that teach old-fashioned values through "hands-on" participation.

Each Scout is encouraged to live their lives by abiding by the 12 core values of Cub Scouting: Citizenship, Compassion, Cooperation, Courage, Faith, Health and Fitness, Honesty, Perseverance, Positive Attitude, Resourcefulness, Respect and Responsibility.

The Indian Hill Cub Scout Pack meets at the Indian Hill Primary School on the third Tuesday of every month throughout the school year. These meetings have included the ever popular Scout Olympics, the Pinewood Derby, the Raingutter Regatta, Big Cats and Birds of Prey visits from the Cincinnati Zoo, shows performed by the Madcap Theater, Theatre Four and demonstrations in rocket or science experiments by MadScience.

A Cub Scout Pack is divided into smaller groupings based on school grade levels called Dens. Most Dens meet twice a month. The Scouts get to learn new things such as the proper care of the American flag, craftsmanship, woodworking, leatherworking, the importance of team work and being a responsible member of our community. They also study and visit historical sites in our community, engage in service projects and attend family campouts at Camp Friedlander. While at camp the boys learn to fish, put up a tent, make a fire, cook over a fire, navigate using maps, and learn archery and BB shooting skills.

RANGER CHAT

On May 9th, the Ranger's, along with the Indian Hill Rangers Benefit Fund, sponsored a Women's Self Defense Class. The class was instructed by Ptl. Carl Watts and Det. Steve Makin, of the Rangers. There were about 25 women in attendance, from age 15 to 75. The class was designed to give women some basic instruction on how to defend themselves in an attack by another person. They were not only given the instructions, but they were able to perform the moves on another person, as a way to help ensure that they were doing them correct.

Overall, the group seemed to think that the class was very beneficial. Some of the comments from the group were - "fast paced and entertaining...", "...hands on, being able to use what we learn.", "...real and upfront.", and "I feel more confident." It is our hope that no one is ever put in a situation that their safety or life may be in danger, but with the help of this class, perhaps these 25 women will be better prepared to protect themselves.

Underage Drinking

As we enter the summer months, the Rangers want to remind parents of some very important facts regarding alcohol and underage drinking.

In 2007, 18% of 16-20 year old passenger vehicle drivers fatally injured in crashes had high BAC's (Blood Alcohol Concentration) of .08% or higher. While .08% is often the term used for "legally drunk", a person under 21 should not be drinking and should therefore register .00%. While studies show that young drivers are less likely than adults to drive after drinking alcohol, their crash risk is substantially higher when they do.

The US Department of Health & Human Services states that each year, approximately 5,000 young people under that age of 21 die as a result of underage drinking; this includes about 1,900 deaths from motor vehicle crashes, 1,600 as a result of homicides, 300 from suicide, as well as hundreds from other injuries such as falls, burns and drowning.

So what is a drink? For the purpose of this article, a standard drink is any drink that contains about 14 grams of pure alcohol (about 0.6 fluid ounces or 1.2 tablespoons). For example one 12-ounce beer, one 4 to 5 ounce glass of wine or one 1.5 ounce shot of 80 proof liquor.

BAC of .01% to .05% Note that for many people only "one" drink will take them to this level of decreased coordination.

Some to great loss of judgment and coordination, thinking dulled changes in mood and behavior.

BAC of .05% to .08% Note that everyone has reached this point after just their 1st or 2nd drink.

Functioning ability definitely impaired.

BAC of .08% and over Note that some people reach this point by their 2nd drink and ALL have by their 3rd or 4th.

Functioning and judgment very seriously affected.

** Remember that sex, health and state of mind make all these expectations a bit variable. **

In the State of Ohio:

- As a parent, you cannot furnish/serve alcohol to any person under the age of 21 (other than your own child) for any reason, **even with the permission of their parent(s).**
- You cannot knowingly allow a person under 21, other than your own child, to remain in your home or on your property while consuming or in possession of alcohol.

If you break the law:

- You can face a maximum sentence of six months of jail/or a \$1,000.00 fine.
- Others can sue you if you give alcohol to anyone under 21, and they, in turn, hurt themselves or damage property.
- Officers can take any alcohol, money or property used in committing the offense.

While parents think they have the best intentions by hosting a party, the liability far out weighs the intent. As a parent you should refuse to supply alcohol and be at home if you allow your children to have a party. Make sure that no alcohol is brought into your home or onto your property by your teen's friends. Finally, let your child know the consequences to underage drinking and how it will not only affect their lives but possibly yours as well.

2009 SUMMER RECREATION PROGRAM TO BEGIN JUNE 15



The 2008 Summer Recreation Program at Stephan Field will begin on June 15, 2009 and continue through July 31, 2009. The program will start at 10:00 a.m. each day and end at 3:00 p.m. The recreation program operation will be separate from the tennis camp, which will be operated by the Camargo Racquet Club at the Stephan Field courts. Attendees will enjoy many of the favorite activities from previous years, such as; basketball, baseball, soccer, water day on Fridays and board games/crafts.

As in previous years, a parent or guardian must register each participant the first time they attend. Children must be at least 6 years old by June 16. We will require each participant between the ages of 6-11 years of age to be signed in and out by a parent or baby-sitter. Older participants may sign themselves in and out. The directors will follow-up with the parent of any child who was signed in by a parent but failed to sign out before leaving the park. The children are expected to follow the program rules. Those who do not will be sent home immediately.

Kelly Iles will be the program director again this year. Mrs. Iles is an employee of the Indian Hill Primary School and is familiar with many of the kids who will attend the program. The assistant program director will be Erica Jones other assistants are Jon Eberle and John Blazic. The Indian Hill Recreation Commission offers the Stephan Field program for recreation use only. IT IS NOT A BABY SITTING SERVICE OR DAY CARE CENTER. Your cooperation with the program directors is most appreciated.

The program directors are not able to stay at Stephan Field beyond closing and clean-up time (3:15 p.m.). After this time children ages 6-11 will be escorted to the Indian Hill Ranger Station. Given that the Arboretum specializes in conifers and evergreens and it is springtime; it seems only appropriate to feature a specimen that blooms. You may not know this but many of our conifers do in fact bloom. The male inflorescences, and the female flowers which eventually turn into cones, can be rather showy this time of year.

colors that can be seen range from gold to reds to even purples and blues depending on the specie.

The *Picea abies* 'Acrocona' or commonly called a red flowering dwarf Norway spruce is one such plant. This one in particular is even more interesting because the female flowers are formed on the tips of the new spring growth. They start out greenish purple then turning pinkish and eventually becoming bright raspberry red. Quite a contrast with the dark green foliage and the other new bright green spring growth of the spring season!

Our specimen is located along the cypress mulch path that leads northwesterly from the patio area in front of the Arboretum Center, across from the caged Dorothy Rowe crabapple.

Be sure to visit the Arboretum this spring to see this and the other 1400 or so different plants on display. We are sure you will find the gardens a great place to relax and discover the many colors of our conifers.

DOGS ON LEASH AT GRAND VALLEY



The management at Grand Valley Preserve is requesting cooperation from all visitors of the Preserve. It is mandatory that all dogs be kept on a leash during the bird-nesting season. The Preserve not only has numerous species of waterfowl nesting, but also has woodcocks, Killdeers, and the rare Cricket Frogs that nest on the shoreline. Visitors will be given one warning. On the second violation, they will be requested to leave the Preserve. The leash restriction will be in effect from March 15 through June 30. A major part of the mission statement at Grand Valley is to protect the wildlife and the environment by maintaining low impact activities at the Preserve. While all other nature preserves require dogs to be leashed at all times, the staff at Grand Valley understands the desire to allow dogs to run free, but remember dogs must be under control. Please help the wildlife and honor this regulation.

Looking Back in Time at Ambleside

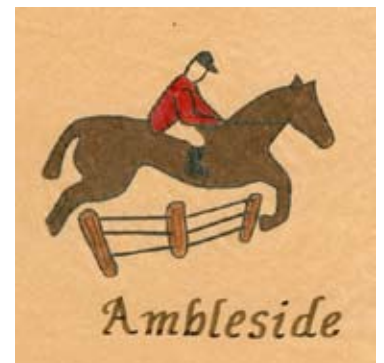
The 1920s marked the beginning of the Estate Era, when Indian Hill was transformed from a farming community to residences for some of Cincinnati's most prominent families. Fabulous homes surrounded by rolling farmland were built as the Camargo Realty Company attracted buyers. One of these estates was Ambleside, situated at the corner of Blome and Keller Roads.



Built in 1928 for Mr. & Mrs. Leonard Smith, Jr., and reminiscent of a European manor house, the complex is a monument to an earlier epoch. Architect John Henri Deekin designed the 12,000 square foot abode. The Smiths, who were enamored of England, perhaps named it Ambleside for the hamlet of that same name in Great Britain. Situated on 180 acres, the estate included 4 tenant houses, miscellaneous farm buildings, a greenhouse, tennis courts, pool, and pool house. The landscape design plan was devised by A.D. Taylor of Cleveland, and featured lawns, formal hedge rows, courts, gardens, vineyards, orchards, pasture, and a wide variety of trees. The gatehouse at the entrance was awarded first place by the Cincinnati Institute of Architects in 1929, and the plaque recognizing this honor still remains attached to the structure. Here the retainer, Willis, lived and watched those who entered and exited the grounds.

After entering the estate through the gatehouse, a long curving driveway leads to the stone courtyard at the residence. The exterior reminds one of a medieval chateau, with slate roof, stone, stucco, and half timber construction. The entry hall – where 20 foot tall Christmas trees stood for the Smith family - has a full cathedral ceiling. Built for gracious living, Ambleside's elegant details were constructed by yesteryear's talented artisans.

Ruth and Leonard Smith raised three children (Ruth, Stephen, and Jane) at Ambleside. Mr. Smith was President and later Chairman of National Marking Machine Company in Northside. An enthusiastic horseman, he was joint Master of the Camargo Hunt, a member of the Ohio Valley Thoroughbred Club and the Masters of Foxhounds Association of America. His interest in equestrian sports is reflected in the crest symbol of Ambleside - a rider jumping a fence. The estate was a regular fixture for the Camargo Hunt. Four horses were stabled on the property and there was a large staff to manage the grounds, gardens, and farm. Chickens, sheep, cows, and mules were on site throughout the 1930s, and a full garden provided some produce for the family. The Smiths were most hospitable and enjoyed entertaining their guests lavishly. Ruth's debutante party featured the Jan Savitt Orchestra, and her extravagant wedding was also held at her childhood home.



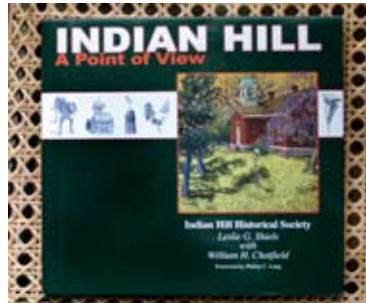
The second owners of the estate were Mr. & Mrs. Charles Schott. They purchased it in 1954, with hopes of raising a large family there. When her husband died in 1968, Marge inherited Ambleside, which she called "Charley's Castle", as well as his car dealership and other enterprises. Though she was childless, she was passionate about children, animals and her hometown. At one time 22 St Bernards resided on the property. An owner of the Cincinnati Reds, Marge decorated her 19 room home with abundant baseball memorabilia and photos of dogs and celebrities. A generous philanthropist, she opened the estate for charitable benefits and rallies which featured Reds players, Buicks, and animals, including elephants from the Cincinnati Zoo. Mrs. Schott died in 2004. Under the terms of her will Ambleside was deeded to the Schott Foundation, and in 2008 HPA Development Group acquired the property for development
